



- *Zaccheus experienced rejection,  
but discovered repentance and restoration*
- *stamped, sealed and guaranteed by the Spirit. Ephesians 1: 13 - 14*
- *consistency of faith and works means that the story  
of faith and witness continues through you*

**A changed life**

Origen, a Christian in the third century AD, talked with a pagan who said that Jesus was followed by "the rag, tag and bobtail of humanity".

Origen acknowledged that Jesus called those who were down and beaten by life “*But Jesus does not leave them that way. He fashions people of strength, giving them back self-respect, enabling them to stand on their feet ... they were cowed, cringing, broken things but God has set them free.*”

God has set you free. Go live in that freedom. Be a saint.
