May we be fed by your love and set free by your power and may we go from this place refreshed and renewed by your spirit. In the name of Jesus we pray. Amen.

Even when the world rejected Jesus, on the very night that he was betrayed, he continued to care for others and to feed them. This was God's love in action.

Jesus invited all to eat with him, especially those who were fearful or felt rejected and despised by others.

Jesus invites us to eat with him now.

We take these symbols of bread and the cup and do what Jesus asked of his followers. We remember Jesus.

## We remember Christ's story. We celebrate his life among us.

With friends gathered for a special meal, on the last night they shared together, Jesus took bread and gave thanks to God.

He broke the bread and shared it, saying

*Take, eat – Each time you do this, remember me.* 

After they had eaten, Jesus took the cup and shared it with them, saying,

"Drink from this all of you. My life is poured out for you. All may share in God's covenant of love." Whenever you drink this, remember me.

The God of grace welcomes us all to this table, this moment of communion with God and with each other. **We who are many are one body for we all share the one bread.** These are the gifts of God for the people of God. **May we who share these gifts be in Christ and Christ in us.** 

The elders will come to serve you where you are seated. Please eat the bread when you receive it But hold the cup so that we may drink together as a symbol of our unity in Christ. We are all one in Christ Jesus. Come let us drink together.

The peace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you all evermore. **Amen.**
