A Financial Health Check

As the Church reviews the budget annually, we ask that parishioners review their giving.

One thing that is really appreciated is having a reasonable idea of our annual income and to help with that it is always appreciated that whatever you are able to give is given regularly whether it be weekly, monthly or annually and the amount is reviewed annually. Making the commitment to give a stated amount each year assists the church in its planning and budgeting.

We are also very aware that people are often on limited incomes or have many other commitments so there may be occasions when the amount may need to be reduced rather than increased. The important thing is your giving is reviewed and it is given regularly if possible.
