

Who is this man, who gathered people to him, and touched their lives along each dusty way: who spoke to all with passion and with peacefulness and valued all their ordinary days?

Who is this man, who, at the long day's ending, would draw apart to wait on Gad and pray, and, in the mystery that knows no ending would find God's wisdom and would know God's words to say?

Who is this man who gave to women dignity in partnership of worth and equal grace? Who listened to the stories that they told him, and honoured each, whatever was their place: who let them choose to come and join his company and learned with them God's love of every race, who showed to each the courage of their nature to care and tend each lonely and each suffering face.

Who is this man who calls us now to follow, a shadow presence asking us to be companions on the way through this life journey, to live in truth, to set our tired world free? So, let us find each other now in partnership, with ears to hear and eyes awake to see, that we might grow in grace and understanding, and walk beside that man who comes from Galilee.

Today we will hear some stories of Jesus using the verses of a lovely old song and various readings from the gospels. The first reading comes from the gospet of Mark (and is also found in Matthew and Luke)

Bible Reading: Mark 10: 13-16 Jesus blesses little children
Some people brought children to Jesus for Him to place His hands on
them, but the disciples scolded the people. When Jesus noticed this, He
was angry and said to His disciples" Let the children come to me, and
do not stop them, because the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these.
I assure you that whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God like a
child will never enter it". Then He took the children in His arms,
placed His hands on each of them and blessed them.

<u>Reading</u>: The first rwo verses of the song *Tell me the stories of Jesus*.

Reading: Matthew 21: 6-9 (Also found in Mark, Luke and John)
Look your King is coming to you! He is humble and rides on a donkey! The disciples went off, as Jesus had told them, and found the young donkey, they threw their cloaks on him and Jesus got on. A large crowd of people spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The people walking in front and behind Jesus began to shout "Praise to David's Son! God bless Him who comes in the Name of the Lord! Praise God!"

Two poems

Verse four of our focal song tells of a storm – it was not "plain sailing" for Jesus and his followers.

Reading: Luke 8: 22-25 (also found in Marrhew and Mark)

Jesus calms the storm

One day Jesus got into a boat with the disciples and said to them "Let us go across to the other side of the lake" So they started out. As they were sailing, Jesus fell asleep. Suddenly a strong wind blew down on the lake and the boat began to fill with water so that they were all in great danger. The disciples woke Jesus saying "Master, Master, we are about to die!" Jesus got up and gave an order to the wind and the stormy waters. They died down and there was a great calm. Then He said to the disciples "Where is your faith?" But they were amazed and afraid, and said to one another "Who is this man? He gives orders to the winds and waves, and they obey Him!"

We are still asking "Who is this man?"

Jesus calls us! O'er the tumult

Jesus calls us! By your mercy, Saviour, make us hear your call, Give our hearts to your obedience, Serve and love you best of all.

<u>Reading</u>: Jesus tells of Gods love in so many ways. Verse 5 of our song is worth another look

Tell how the sparrow that twitters on yonder tree And the sweet meadow-side lily may speak to me – Give me their message, for I would hear How Jesus taught us our Father's care.

Poem

The last verse of our song is bitter-sweet but is <u>not the end of the story</u>. Rather it is a new beginning; full of hope.

Reading: Matthew 28: 5-8 (also found in Mark, Luke and John)
The angel spoke to the women "You must not be afraid. I know you are looking for Jesus who was crucified, He is not here, He has been raised, just as He said. Come and see the place where He was lying. Go quickly now and tell His disciples He has been raised from death and is going to Galilee ahead of you, there you will see Him! Remember what I have told you". So they left the tomb in a hurry, afraid and yet filled with joy and ran to tell His disciples.
