RECIPE FOR THE MONTH Potato, cauliflower & pea curry



- •1 small onion, chopped
- •1 clove garlic, crushed
- •1 tsp minced ginger
- ½ red chilli, deseeded and finely chopped (optional)
- •2 tsp ground curry powder
- •400g can tin Indian Style Tomatoes
- •400g potatoes, Agria, cut into 1cm cubes
- •3 cups (300g) cauliflower
- •½ cup frozen peas
- •Unsweetened natural yoghurt
- •Freshly chopped coriander to garnish
- Heat a dash of oil in a medium sized saucepan. Add onion and cook over a medium to low heat until softened. Add the garlic, ginger, red chilli and curry powder. Stir and cook a further minute.
- Pour over Indian Style Tomatoes and add the potatoes. Bring sauce to the boil.
 Reduce heat to a simmer and cook uncovered for 20 minutes.
- If the sauce reduces too much during this time cover saucepan with a lid. Add cauliflower and the baby peas. Continue cooking for a further 5-10 minutes until vegetables are tender and sauce is thick. Serve with a dollop of natural unsweetened yoghurt, garnished with freshly chopped coriander.

The story of Adam and Eve was being carefully explained in the children's Sunday School class. Following the story, the children were asked to draw some picture that would illustrate the story.


Little Bobby was most interested and drew a picture of a car with three people in it. In the front seat, behind the wheel was a man and in the back seat, a man and a woman.
