We gather today in the shadow of the Cross.

Evil abounds. Jesus goes forth to suffer and die.

How we tremble with fear!

How we weep.

Why have we forsaken Him?

Why have we betrayed and run from his Passion?

Lord, have mercy upon us.

Christ, have mercy upon us.

Readings from Psalm 22

Reader 1 (at the back of the congregation)

My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?

O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest. Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel. In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.

**Ah, holy Jesus, how hast thou offended,
that man to judge thee hath in hate pretended?
By foes derided, by thine own rejected,
O most afflicted.**

Alas, my treason, Jesus, hath undone thee.
'Twas I, Lord Jesus, I it was denied thee:
I crucified thee.**

Reader 2 (from the right side of the congregation)

I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint;
my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast; my mouth is
dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws;
you lay me in the dust of death. For dogs are all around me;
a company of evildoers encircles me. My hands and feet have
shrivelled; I can count all my bones. They stare and gloat over
me; they divide my clothes among themselves, and for my
clothing they cast lots. But you, O Lord, do not be far away!
O my help, come quickly to my aid! Deliver my soul from the
sword, my life from the power of the Dog! Save me from the
mouth of the lion!
From the horns of the wild oxen you have rescued me.

We read – Ah, holy Jesus *CH4 #381*, vv 3-4

**Lo, the good Shepherd for the sheep is offered;
the slave hath sinned, and the Son hath suffered;
for man's atonement, while he nothing heedeth,
God intercedeth.**

**For me, kind Jesus, was thy incarnation,
thy mortal sorrow, and thy life's oblation;
thy death of anguish and thy bitter passion,
for my salvation.**
