Message from the Minister

Dear Friends

September already — and this marks a new phase in my life with you.

I was originally



contracted to work with Gisborne Presbyterian Parish and St David's Presbyterian Parish as Transitional Minister for two years - to finish on 31 August 2019. I will now be staying for another six months at 75% time, finishing on 8 March 2020, unless another minister is called and wants to start before that. My last service with St David's, however, is on 1st September 2019, so the next stage for me is with you alone. I am pleased to be able to continue for a while because I really appreciate the privilege of being with you. This is a special parish, with wonderful people, and a great commitment to and enthusiasm for God and each other. Thank you for asking me to continue to lead and guide you.

The last month has included much that is typical in the life of any parish minister — weekly service preparation, two funerals, three study groups, parish council and other committee meetings, visits to and connections with many people, preparation of the Annual Report, but also a Vision and Strategy meeting at which all present wrestled with what goals does the parish need to have for the future? It is exciting when people want to think about how simple things can be done more effectively, decide on small changes that will improve things for

everyone, and take the steps needed to put those into action. You will find a report of that event in this edition of Signpost.

On September 22 there is a congregational meeting, the AGM, to review the last year and thank all who have been in leadership positions or served in some way, as well as look to the future. We can certainly thank God for all who are serving others by using their particular gifts and skills. There will also be an opportunity on 6 October, World Communion Sunday, to thank God for all the blessings we receive. After that service, you might like to take part in a Discover Your Gifts exercise which should be illuminating, affirming and fun - and share lunch together.

The readings for recent services have allowed us to continue to explore the ministry of Jesus as recorded in the Gospel of Luke; the letters to the Galatians, Colossians and Hebrews; and some delving into the prophets, Amos, Hosea and Isaiah – they all have a **powerful message about trusting God** and knowing that God is with us always, even in the darkest of times.

May you continue to value each other, to take steps to improve the lives of all with whom you connect, maybe with your smile - and to trust God in everything.

WORKS & PROPERTY

The Parish Council has decided to thank and discharge the current Works and Property Committee at the AGM on 22 September. Instead of a Committee, the AGM will appoint a **Property Co-ordinator** for each site: Matawhero and 176 Cobden Street.

The Property Co-ordinator's responsibilities will include:

- a. co-ordinating and organising day to day maintenance in liaison with the Office Administrator, volunteers and professionals
- b. organising working bees as required
- c. obtaining quotes for planned property & maintenance work
- d. overseeing such projects once quotes are approved by the Parish Council
- e. report regularly to Parish Council

Alongside this development, there will be an expansion of Parish Council governance and responsibility in parish property matters:

- a. annual property inspections
- **b.** three year and annual property works and maintenance plans
- c. annual insurance cover

BLESSING AND RE-DEDICATION OF REV JOHN McARA HEADSTONE



will be at Makaraka Cemetery at 2 p.m. on Wednesday 25 September

Rev John McAra was Minister of Gisborne Presbyterian Church, including Matawhero, from 1878 – 1890. He is buried in Makaraka Cemetery. His headstone, along with many others at that cemetery, was lost under grass and earth for a long time. The headstones have recently been restored and the Parish Council has decided that it would be good to have a Rededication and Blessing of this headstone.

THE VISION, STRATEGY AND GOALS WORKSHOP ON 22 AUGUST 2019 involved 20 enthusiastic people. They explored what vision means, and some Biblical examples, thought about the Parish Mission Statement "We are a diverse community called together by Jesus Christ to welcome, love, serve and care", considered individual visions and accepted that a group vision needed to be a Vibrant, Intriguing, Significant, Involving, Owned, Now statement, thought about the strengths the parish has and using those to develop future strategy, and discussed creating some SMART Goals for the next six months, and the steps that need to be taken to achieve them.

In the course of discussion, it was agreed that in the next 6 months, with the Transitional Minister to guide us, the parish needs to:

- develop a vision for the future which the parish adopts as a guide to go forward.
 It was acknowledged, however, that the current Parish Profile, Mission Plan, Ministry
 Expectations, as well as the Mission Statement, do describe our vision and provide an excellent basis for specific goals.
- acknowledge and strengthen what we value as being part of the Gisborne Presbyterian Parish
- prepare for a new minister for a 3 year term or a vacancy
- further strengthen and support leadership development including worship, study groups, praying with others and reaching out to our community,
- ensure sound financial management through budget planning to ensure our finances are sufficient to meet our plans including ministry and maintenance of buildings

Practical actions we believe we can take following this workshop are

 Getting Sunday's reflections and readings extracted from the service material and made available on the website and in hard copy for people to contemplate following the service.

- Establish a Study group to meet and discuss the content of the service reflections on a weekly basis, beginning in mid to late September
- Nametags to be reinstituted, as part of being a
 welcoming Church, and will be handed out in the
 foyer prior to the service. Parishioners will be
 encouraged to wear their name tags.
- People on door duty to be encouraged to welcome visitors, including those who come in late, give them name tags and sit with them or arrange for someone to do so, if they are alone

Recommendation from participants of this workshop to Parish Council

That Parish Council give the parish the opportunity to revisit the Report of the Special Property Task Group by November 2019

ACTIONS ALREADY IN PROGRESS AS A RESULT OF THE VISION WORKSHOP:

- 1. The text of Reflections is available, from 25 August, and will be for all Sundays Mary is responsible for the service.
- 2. A three week trial of an opportunity for *Reflection on the Reflection* will happen on Mondays 16, 23 and 30 September at 5.30pm
- 3. Everyone is encouraged to wear their name tags in church and to morning tea. By 15 September we will ensure that there is a name tag available for all regular attenders, with temporary ones available for visitors or newcomers until permanent ones are made.
- 4. There will be a fun opportunity to Discover Your Gifts after the Parish World Communion Day service on 6 October a workshop with shared lunch for all who want to participate.
- 5. Further learning and growing opportunities will be provided for all interested in November and February to extend leadership development.
