

URGENT REQUEST – ROOF APPEAL

Major leaks occurred, during recent heavy rain, in the foyer of St Andrews causing damage to the toilet and surrounding area. This leak was a result of corrosion of the roofing iron on the church tower, pigeons being a large cause of this problem but it is also a very difficult area to access, making maintenance difficult.

After being advised by roofing experts we are going to need to repair this section of the church roof. While repair to damage to the foyer area will be covered by insurance, the external roof repair is not.

As you are aware we have been operating on a deficit budget so Parish Council, after due consideration, have agreed to approach you as our members for assistance with covering the cost of this work.

The cost is going to be \$25,944 with 1/3 (\$8645) needing to be paid prior to the work being undertaken. We ask you to prayerfully consider if you can support this appeal and if you can make a contribution, it would be much appreciated.
